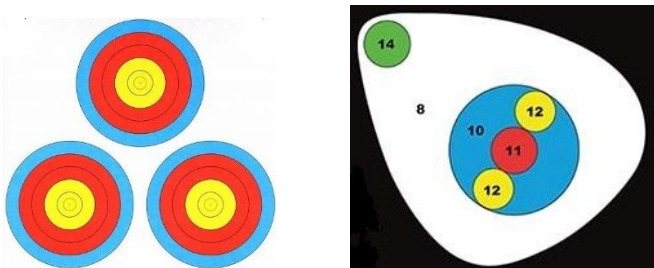
Tournament director – Ben Doyle is updating the ROS to reflect these changes, which are effective immediately.

CHANGES TO THE 2023 SCORE CARD

The 3DAAA committee are trialling a new score card for the 2023 season. It was felt that a more streamlined approach when scoring would be easier for the archer when filling out the information during the competition.

Changes are:

- One column for you to place your exact score in, reducing the risk of placing a score in the wrong column and adding it up incorrectly.
- There is an added column for you to put your initial in when a mistake is made and requires correcting.
- On the right-hand side of the progressive score, there is an area added for you to put your total of 11's, 10's, 8's, 5's and 0's scored. This can be used to help you with a quick score check, and for the main purpose to provide the score recorders an easier quick and accurate way to do a count back, when required.





	Blue Peg: 50 yards (45.72meters) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Semi Pro • KC (Known Class)
	Green Peg: 45 yards (41.15 meters) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • MBO • MBR • MSR • KHC (Known Hunter Class)
	Red Peg: 40 yards (36.56 meters) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • FBO • SMC • ACH • YMR 15-17
	Yellow Peg: 35 yards (32 meters) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • FBR • HC • BF • YMR 12-14
	Orange Peg: 30 yards (27.43 meters) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • RU • FHC • CU • YF • YU
	White Peg: 25 yards (22.86 meters) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • TRAD • LB • CUBA • CUBF • CUBU

Targets shall be set at unmarked distances. The approximate maximum distance for each stake shall be as stated, with a maximum variance of 5%.
